Theme:

Pokémon and Canada's Sesquicentennial. We encourage you to decorate your campsite on theme. Prizes will be awarded for best-decorated site in each Sub-camp. Packs may bring White Tail Beavers swimming up to their pack or KIM Scouts as part of their youth contingent.

Arrival/Unloading:

- Scouter arrival time is after 2:00 pm on Friday June 9. Trailers should arrive prior to 5:30 PM. Trailer arrival a day early may be available on request. Be advised though we are not responsible for your trailer's security.
- Upon arrival, Security will provide you with your Sub-camp and site number. Sub-camp are based on the Pokémon GO Teams of Mystic (Yellow), Instinct (Blue) and Valour (Red).
- If you have a trailer, it can be kept on your site only if you can fit your dining tent and campers within your site borders, otherwise it must be parked in the designated parking area. You may also be asked to move your trailer at the discretion of the camp chief.
- Cub/parent arrival time is after 5:30 PM. Youth will be directed to their camp by Security Personnel.

Departure:

- Please clean up your site and take all your garbage with you. **There is no on-site disposal for garbage**. You will need to get your site checked by a member of the Security or Cuboree Leadership Team. When you get the OK, you are free to leave and thank you for your help.
- Pick-up time for parents is 10 AM Sunday, June 11th. Pack departure time is no later than 12:00 PM Noon on June 11th.

Registration:

- Payment in full less your \$25 deposit is due on arrival. Fees are \$23/per scouter or youth attending for packs registered before April 28th. The fee increases to \$25/per scouter or youth after that date.
- Please register and pay for your pack at the Security Tent once you have dropped off your trailer. You will receive your pack welcome package with camp map, activity list, and other details you will need for the weekend.
- Photographs may be taken for use on our website or social media. Packs are responsible for advising camp staff at registration if there are cubs in their pack who have indicated NO on their member photo release.
- 1 copy of the medical/fitness form for each Youth, Parent Volunteer and Scouter attending to be provided at registration. These forms will be used by Medical Personnel for the weekend. You must pick up your forms after closing on Sunday. Any documents not picked up will be destroyed. Please do not hand in any irreplaceable originals, only copies. NOTE THAT GROUPS MUST ALSO HAVE A COPY OF THEIR OWN MEDICAL/FITNESS FORMS FOR THEIR OWN LEADERSHIP TEAM AT THEIR CAMPSITE.

• Bring completed parent/guardian consent forms to participate in Archery and Hatchet Throwing keynote activities.

• Non-refundable deposit of \$25 is due on registration. Please make cheques payable to Scouts Canada. Address to send the cheque/deposit to will be contained in your confirmation e-mail.

First Aid and Emergencies:

- CECuboree offers medical support with the dedicated assistance of Medical Venturer Volunteers starting at 5 PM on Friday. Please report all accidents to the Medical Venturer headquarters. All youth must be accompanied by an adult to be seen. If an ambulance is required for transportation, any costs incurred will be the responsibility of the Pack Leader and/or Parent. As mentioned in the registration section, copies of the medical/fitness forms for all participating members is required.
- In the event of fire, please keep all your people together in a safe location. Please keep fire lanes and driveways clear for emergency equipment. Evacuations will be co-ordinated by the Security Chief.
- CECuboree is not inviting bad weather to our camp. Camp staff will monitor Environment Canada and if there is a weather advisory or warning announcements will be made by the Security Chief.
- All packs are required to ensure they have their own qualified first aid scouter and first aid kit for their pack.

Prohibitions:

WEAPONS, RADIOS (especially FRS type Radios), DRUGS, ALCOHOL, FIREWORKS, AC/DC TV'S, PETS AND SMALL CHILDREN... Leave them at home!!! Anyone found with weapons, non- prescription drugs or alcohol will be turned over to the Police. Youth are not allowed to have cigarettes on site as Canadian Law prohibits the sale of tobacco to minors. The Staff will be using FRS Radios for communication, so please leave yours at home.

Special Equipment:

- Blank light coloured/white Tee shirts there will be a Silkscreen Tee-shirt activity for Cubs and Scouters with Red Ink. Packs are required to bring their own shirts to participate. For best pricing, we suggest checking out local teamwear/custom tee printer about overstocks to be used for a scouting craft. Craft store or local second-hand stores are other options we recommend.
- GPS or GPS enabled smart phone There will be a Pokémon GO style Catch'em activity utilizing GPS co-ordinates that will be in your Welcome package. These will also assist your pack with finding activities. If you intend to divide your pack for rotations, please make sure you have sufficient equipment numbers to fully enjoy this activity.
- Towels/Extra change of clothes water based activities will be offered weather permitting. One activity is a Dunk Tank where Scouters will be invited to be dunked by their Cubs.

• Special fixings/toppings to make a unique pancake if you have a group cubs who would be interested in our Special Feature Cub "Iron Pancake Chef" Competition. Details of this special sign-up competition will be posted on the event website closer to the day.

Scouter Supervision:

- Please ensure that your pack has ample supervision. BP&P requirements are considered a MINIMUM. Proper scouting behaviour is expected. Although it would grieve us to do so, we will remove packs that insist on repeatedly acting in a non-scouting manner.
- If at all possible, please bring extra Leaders or Parent Volunteers to assist in running events. We are fortunate to have Offers of Service, but more help is always needed. If your group has a surplus of scouters above ratio we would strongly encourage you to sign up on registration to assist with running an activity, even if only for a short time. Please also encourage older section youth to consider attending as Offer of Service.

Washrooms:

Portable toilets will be located through the sub-camp areas, and there are outhouses located throughout the camp. Note that there are no outhouses near the archery range.

Uniforms, Flags and Ceremonies:

Please send only Pack flags to the opening. The whole camp will assemble at 8:30 a.m. for a 9:00 a.m. opening. Group neckers are a must for opening. Cub shirts at opening will be encouraged, weather permitting. We encourage theme dress for camp spirit. A great way to involve your Cubs. See page 9 for the Grand Howl version we will be using for Opening.

Food, Cooking, and Water:

- Groups are responsible for bringing their own food and food storage supplies.
- **Propane only** for cooking fuel. Absolutely no liquid fuels, charcoal pits or fires will be allowed.
- If your Group has Offer of Service youth or adults attending, please co-ordinate food with them. They have the option of cooking their own, but please communicate to ensure all our OOS volunteers are well fed.
- You must provide a dining tent/area for your pack. It is strongly recommended that groups bring their own dining tables and chairs. There are a limited number of picnic tables available on request. The number of tables will be determined by the camp staff based on a first come first serve basis using your registration date with an approximate ration of 1 table per 10-12 campers.
- If you are sharing cooking equipment/dining area with another pack, please note that in special requests when you register or notify the camp co-ordinator.
- Well based drinking water is available at various locations throughout the camp. No washing may be done at water stations.
- You will be advised of grey water disposal locations for each sub-camp.

Friday Activities - Friendship Fires and Movie:

- We will be offering friendship fires Friday evening from 7 to 10 PM at locations designated in your welcome package. You may bring marshmallows or hotdogs for your youth to roast at these locations only. Please limit your time and be respectful of others. You may need to be patient and wait your turn depending on numbers at any given time.
- We will be offering an optional movie Friday night.

Saturday Activities

- There will be 30+ activities offered around the Blue Heron and Blue Springs sides of the camp on Saturday. Generally the activities will be run in an open rotation style so your pack decides on the activities they want to do.
- CECuboree will provide the basic activity materials. If your group can provide equipment to add to one of the activities, or if you have expertise and interest in your group to run an activity that's not listed please contact the camp co-ordinator at <u>contact@cecuboree.scouter.ca</u>. We need your imagination to theme it and run the activity. You will be contacted with further information to do this.
- Volunteers are needed to assist with running the pre-planned activities. The activities list with volunteer numbers needed is available on the Pack and Offers of Service Registration page. Please indicate an activity you could provide a scouter or two to assist with running. Please also encourage your Group Venturer and Rover youth to consider attending as an Offer of Service.
- There will be four key activities with scheduled time-slots. They are archery, hatchet throwing, pond dipping, and low ropes. Please identify your preferences iwhen you register. You will be allotted space to at least one of these activities based on your registration date, preferences, and pack numbers in your Welcome Package on arrival. Large groups of 20+ may be divided, and smaller packs be combined to share a time slot for a key activity.
- Your pack is responsible for arriving in a timely fashion to their keynote activity.
- Training for volunteers interested in assisting with the Low Ropes Course will be provided by Paul Garofolo the camp ranger on Friday June 9th.
- Saturday morning we are also planning to offer an optional Iron Pancake Chef Competition for Single or small groups of Cubs during the breakfast time. Details of this will be made available on the event website closer to the date. Please indicate if you have Cubs that would be interested in participating in this when you register.

Scouter Charging Station:

During the camp, Security Head Quarters will have a charging station set up for Offer of Service and Scouters ONLY to use. CECuboree is not responsible for any lost or stolen electronics.

Coffee and Tea:

Coffee and tea will be available to all Offers of Service and Scouters at Security Head Quarters. Please bring your own mug.

Lost and Found:

If there are any items left behind at your activity, please give them to a Security Personnel or please bring them to Security Headquarters when you have a chance. If you lose something, please go to Security Headquarters to see if it has been returned.

Security:

Lights out/quiet time is 10:00 p.m until 6:00 AM. Please respect the right of your neighbours to attempt to get some sleep. Tent raiding or destroying property will result in immediate removal from camp. Please note that it is private property on the south tree-line of the main camp area. Trespassing will not be tolerated. Please slow down as you drive through the camp, SPEED LIMIT IS 5MPH/10KM.

PLEASE READ THIS NOTICE TO YOUR CAMPERS: The security crew is all Scouting volunteers both youth and adult. They are not at camp to give you a hard time but rather to help us ensure that you will have a safe and happy time. Destruction of an event area setup will not be tolerated.

Some activities on Saturday, and the formal campfire Saturday night will be held on the East side of Blue Springs and will require crossing 6th Line Nassagawaya road. There will be a designated crossing location, near Security and the camp will be taking steps to notify drivers of children crossing but IT IS IMPERRATIVE that scouters organize their youth prior to crossing and <u>ONLY CROSS AT THE DESIGNATED</u> LOCATION for safety. YOUTH MUST ONLY CROSS WITH SCOUTER SUPERVISION.

Parking, Late Arrivals, and Early Departures:

If a youth or leader is arriving late/ departing early from the camp, they need to sign out/in at the front gate with the Security personnel posted there. If they are only leaving for a little bit and returning later, they must sign out and sign back in at the Security HQ. Entry to the camp will be limited during Opening and Closing ceremonies. All vehicles staying the weekend will be required to have a Vehicle Information Pass displayed in their windshield (see page 7).

Prizes and Special Sign-ups

There will be a points system associated with the activities detailed in your welcome package on arrival. Points will be accumulated towards your sub-camp. Winning sub-camp will be announced at Saturday campfire.

We are working on other special spirit award prizes. Stay tuned to the web-site for details we will announce over the next little while.

We will be running a Pancake Cook-off Cubs may sign up for. Details for this will be posted on our event website in advance.

Finally, we will also be running a contest for 2018 Theme selection that will give the winning Pack a \$50 credit towards their 2018 Registration Costs. Contest Rules will be on our website. Check it out! Great opportunity for your youth to have their say in next year's event!


